



2010-11 Tz'dakah At a Glance

September:

Bag Hunger – Collected non-perishable food items to donate to Jewish Family Service

Homeless to Renters – Raised \$92 to help H2R identify those in need, find housing within their means, pay the move-in costs, and provide household supplies.

October:

Susan G. Komen Foundation – Raised \$91 to help the largest nonprofit fund dedicated solely to the fight against breast cancer.

November:

Thanksgiving Baskets – We collected food items to provide 15 baskets of Thanksgiving meals for those in need.

Solid Ground – Raised \$30 to purchase additional items for Solid Ground's Thanksgiving Food Baskets.

December:

Light Up Literacy – Collected \$153 to support this program designed to purchase books for children in Guatemala.

January:

Martin Luther King Jr. Rallies – Raised \$80 for two different rallies in honor of Martin Luther King Jr.

Kline Galland Visit – Performed the mitzvah of *kibud z'kainim* (honoring the elderly) by singing for residents of the Kline Galland Home.

February:

Rabbanit Bracha Kapach – Raised \$100 to help Rabbanit Bracha Kapach distribute food to people in need in Israel, particularly Passover meals.

100th Day Mitzvah Project – Collected 100 Children's Books for **Boyer Children's Clinic**, 100 Winter Items for **Ryther Children's Center** and **Baby Corner**, 100 personal needs items for **local shelters** and **food banks**, and 100 Box Tops for Education to support **SJCS**.

March:

Stop Hunger Now's Japan Relief Effort – Collected money to help survivors of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan.

Human Society of Seattle/King County – Collected pet food and pet supplies to help the Human Society's efforts.

Passover Food Drive for JFS – Our own haMoreh Jeff coordinated this partnership with the Jewish Day School, Seattle Hebrew Academy, and the Stroum Jewish Community Center's Early Childhood School to help Jewish Family Service raise food items for Passover baskets.

May and June:

The Friendship Circle of Washington and Shutaf – Collected money to help these two organizations (one in Seattle, the other in Israel) that both work to provide meaningful camp experiences for Jewish children with special needs.
